NOTICE OF INTENDED DECISION

I INTEND TO CONSENT, under section 80.4 of the PBA, to the conversion and transfer of assets from the SEPP to the JSPP in accordance with the application of Providence St. Joseph's and St. Michael's Healthcare ("PJMh") filed on October 12, 2018, with additional materials submitted on November 14, 2018, January 16, 2019, January 31, 2019, February 25, 2019, and February 26, 2019 (the "Application"), provided that the amendment to the SEPP is filed with the Superintendent of Financial Services ("Superintendent") under section 12 of the PBA.

YOU ARE ENTITLED TO A HEARING by the Financial Services Tribunal (the "Tribunal") pursuant to section 89(6) of the PBA. **A hearing before the Tribunal about this Notice of Intended Decision may be requested by completing the enclosed Request for Hearing (Form 1) and submitting it to the Tribunal within 30 days after this Notice of Intended Decision is served on you.**¹ A copy of that form is included with this Notice of Intended Decision. Additional copies can be obtained by visiting the Tribunal's website at www.fstontario.ca.

If a Request for Hearing (Form 1) is submitted to the Tribunal within 30 days after this Notice of Intended Decision is served on you, sections 89(8) and 89(9) of the PBA provide that the Tribunal shall appoint a time for and hold a hearing, and by order may direct the Superintendent to make or refrain from making the intended decision indicated in this notice and to take such action as the Tribunal considers the Superintendent ought to take in accordance with the PBA and the regulations, and for such purposes, the Tribunal may substitute its opinion for that of the Superintendent.

IF NO WRITTEN REQUEST FOR A HEARING IS MADE within 30 days after this Notice is served on you, TAKE NOTICE THAT, provided that the required amendments to the SEPP and the JSPP have been adopted and filed as set out herein, the Superintendent will make the intended decision pursuant to section 89(7) of the PBA.

The hearing before the Tribunal will proceed in accordance with the Rules of Practice and Procedure for Proceedings before the Financial Services Tribunal made under the authority of the *Statutory Powers Procedure Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. S.22. Those Rules are available at the website of the Tribunal at: www.fstontario.ca. REASONS FOR INTENDED DECISION:

1. PJMH is a corporation established by the amalgamation of St. Joseph's Health Centre, St. Michael's Hospital and Providence Healthcare. It sponsors and administers the SEPP, which is a public sector single employer pension plan that qualifies for a conversion and transfer of assets under section 80.4(1) of the PBA. HOOPP is a jointly sponsored pension plan that is sponsored by the Board of Trustees of the Healthcare of Ontario Pension Plan.

2. On October 12, 2019, PJMH filed an application under section 80.4 of the PBA for the Superintendent's approval of a proposed conversion and transfer of assets from the SEPP to the JSPP.
3. The effective date of the proposed conversion and transfer of assets is July 1, 2019.
4. On January 16, 2019, and February 25, 2019, PJMH responded in writing to the Superintendent's request for additional information regarding the Application. On November 14, 2018, January 31, 2019, and February 26, 2019, PJMH submitted additional materials to supplement the Application. These materials included certified copies of the supplementary disclosures that were provided to members and former members, as well as to the trade unions of the SEPP. These supplementary disclosures had no impact on the benefit amounts disclosed in the standard notices.
5. Section 80.4(13) of the PBA provides that the Superintendent shall consent to the conversion and transfer of assets from a single employer pension plan to a jointly sponsored pension plan in accordance with the Application if all of the listed criteria are satisfied. These criteria are set out in section 80.4(13) of the PBA, which states:

80.4 (13) The Superintendent shall consent to the transfer of assets in accordance with the application if all of the following criteria, and such other criteria as may be prescribed, are satisfied:

- 1. Notice of the application for the Superintendent's consent has been given in accordance with this section to the members, former members, retired members and other persons entitled to benefits under the single employer pension plan and to any trade union that represents members of the plan.*
- 2. The employer of the single employer pension plan and the sponsors of the jointly sponsored pension plan have entered into an agreement with respect to the proposed transfer of assets.*
- 3. Notice of the proposed conversion of the pension plan and transfer of assets has been given in accordance with this section to the members, former members, retired members and other persons entitled to benefits under the plan, to any trade union that represents members of the plan and to the Superintendent.*
- 4. Consent to the proposed conversion and transfer of assets has been given or is deemed to have been given, in accordance with this section, by the members, former members, retired members and other persons entitled to benefits under the plan.*
- 5. As of the effective date of the transfer, the employer is a participating employer under the jointly sponsored pension plan.*
- 6. As of the effective date of the transfer, the transferred members and other transferees cease to be entitled to benefits under the single employer pension plan and they are entitled to benefits under the jointly sponsored pension plan.*
- 7. As of the effective date of the transfer, the commuted value of the pension benefits provided under the jointly sponsored pension plan for the transferred members is not less than the commuted value of their pension benefits under the single employer pension plan, as adjusted for any payments made from the single employer pension*

plan to a prescribed retirement savings arrangement or made directly to the transferred members in connection with the transfer of assets.

8. *As of the effective date of the transfer, the pension benefits provided under the jointly sponsored pension plan for the other transferees are, at a minimum, the same as the pension benefits provided for them under the single employer pension plan.*
9. *As of the effective date of the transfer, every transferred member is entitled to credit in the jointly sponsored pension plan for the period of his or her membership in the single employer pension plan for the purpose of determining eligibility for membership in, or entitlement to benefits under, the jointly sponsored pension plan.*

6. The Superintendent is satisfied that the following statutory criteria have been met:

1. Notice of the Application for the Superintendent's consent was provided in accordance with section 80.4(13)1;
2. PJMH and the Board of Trustees of the Healthcare of Ontario Pension Plan entered into an agreement with respect to the proposed conversion and transfer of assets on May 4, 2018, thereby satisfying the criterion in section 80.4(13)2;
3. Notices providing information of the proposed conversion and transfer of assets have been given in accordance with section 80.4(13)3;
4. Consent to the proposed conversion and transfer of assets has been given in accordance with section 80.4(13)4; and
5. PJMH is a partially participating employer in the JSPP in respect of certain of its other employees. As of the effective date of the conversion and transfer of assets, PJMH will fully participate in the JSPP in accordance with section 80.4(13)5.

7. In accordance with Schedule 10 of Ontario Regulation 311/15 ("O. Reg. 311/15"), a proposed amendment to the SEPP was filed as part of the Application. The JSPP had previously filed an amendment that partially satisfied the requirement in Schedule 10 of O. Reg. 311/15. In order for the Superintendent to be satisfied that the criterion under paragraphs 6, 7, 8 and 9 of section 80.4(13) have been met, the following must be satisfied:

1. The JSPP must file with the Superintendent the text of the SEPP in effect immediately prior to the July 1, 2019, transfer effective date, as a document that supports the benefits payable from the JSPP; and
2. The proposed amendment to the SEPP must be formally adopted and an application for the registration of the amendment must be filed with the Superintendent under section 12 of the PBA.

8. Once the SEPP text is filed for the JSPP and the proposed amendment to the SEPP is adopted and filed as set out in paragraph 7 above, the criteria for the Superintendent's consent under paragraphs 6, 7, 8 and 9 of section 80.4(13) of the PBA will be met.

9. Such further and other reasons as may come to my attention.
